Top Storylines

SETTING THE SCENE

No. 14/15 North Dakota and Michigan Tech sit in sixth and seventh in the WCHA standings, respectively. Only one point separates the two teams vying for a coveted top-six spot which will garner home ice in the opening round of the WCHA playoffs. This weekend's series will be the first between the teams this season and first since the Fighting Sioux swept the Huskies in a WCHA first round playoff series last March. UND is coming off a split at Minnesota Duluth last weekend. Tech tied and lost to Nebraska Omaha in Houghton last weekend. This weekend's series will feature two of the nation's top-20-ranked offenses. Both teams average 3.07 goals per game.

STEBNER GETTING MORE INVOLVED IN OFFENSE

Defenseman Brad Stebner scored 55 seconds into Friday night's game for his second goal of the season. It came on a slap shot from the left point and found its way past a screened goaltender. The sophomore defenseman also had an assist in the first period for his first career multi-point game. Stebner has 1-3--4 in his last four outings and 2-9--9 in 58 career games.

HUSKIES SUFFER FIRST SHUTOUT

UNO became the first team to shut out Michigan Tech this season with a 4-0 victory on Saturday (Feb. 11). The Huskies entered the contest with the nation's 13th-ranked scoring offense at 3.13 goals per game. They still rank 17th at 3.07 after the weekend.

PENALTY KILL 92 PERCENT SINCE JAN. 1

Tech's penalty kill improved to 83.8 percent on the season by holding Nebraska Omaha scoreless on seven opportunities last weekend. The Black and Gold have surrendered just three goals on 39 opponent power plays since Jan. 1. That's a 92.3 percent penalty kill in 2012.

More Notes

SENIORS SCORE IN LAST WINTER CARNIVAL

Playing in their last Winter Carnival, senior forwards Bryce Reddick and Jordan Baker each scored goals. Reddick's—his fourth of the season—came in the first period of Friday's game and gave the Huskies a 2-0 lead. Baker's was the game-tying goal in the 3-all tie Friday.

UNBEATEN IN OVERTIME

Michigan Tech remained undefeated in overtime games with a 3-3 tie against Nebraska Omaha last Friday (Feb. 10). The Huskies are 3-0-3 in overtimes in 2011-12 including a 2-0-1 mark in the extra session at home.

TEAM SCORING RACE TIGHTENS

The team scoring race tightened a little last weekend with Jordan Baker (9-16--25) pulling within two points of fellow senior Brett Olson (9-18--27). Three other players are within six points of Olson. Freshman David Johnstone has 9-14--23, sophomore Ryan Furne has 10-12--22 and freshman Blake Pietila has 8-13--21.

JOHNSTONE AND FURNE SCORING STREAKS SNAPPED

Sophomore Ryan Furne and freshman David Johnstone both had five-game point streaks snapped by Nebraska Omaha on Friday. They had combined for eight goals and eight assists over the five-game stretch from Jan. 21-Feb. 4.

CARL FIGURES INTO TWO OF THREE GOALS LAST WEEKEND

Junior defenseman Carl Nielsen had the primary assist on each of Tech's first two goals last Friday to account for two of his six points on the season. The assistant captain has 1-5--6 in 2011-12 and just 3-11--14 points in 93 career games.

SERIES BUSINESS

Michigan Tech and North Dakota will meet for the 242nd and 243rd times this weekend. The all-time series, which began in 1948, leans in the Fighting Sioux's favor 144-89-8. UND is currently on an 11-game winning streak over the Huskies, but Tech has earned some big wins in Grand Forks in the not-too-distant past. Michigan Tech won a playoff game there in 2008 (Mar. 14) by a 3-2 score (in overtime) and swept UND in a two-game series in 2006 (3-1, 3-2 on Dec. 15-16).

THIS AND THAT

Tech presently owns a 10-9-3 record in WCHA play. The Huskies haven't finished at .500 or above since the 1992-93 season when they were 15-12-5. That was also the last season Tech hosted a first-round playoff series ... Friday's game vs. the Fighting Sioux will be the first against a team not nicknamed Mavericks since Jan. 28 ... Scoring first has been critical for Tech this season. The Huskies are 9-2-2 when they tally the first goal of the game and 4-12-1 when they don't.

LOOKING AHEAD

Michigan Tech will play its final home games of the regular season next weekend vs. St. Cloud State. Games are scheduled for Tech's John MacInnes Student Ice Arena Friday and Saturday (Feb. 24-25) at 7:07 p.m. both nights.

Head Coach Mel Pearson

Mel Pearson, who spent the last 23 years at Michigan helping the Wolverines to a 667-243-71 record, 11 Frozen Fours and two national championships, begins his first season as Michigan Tech's head coach in 2011-12.

Pearson, a former winner of the Terry Flanagan Award that honors an assistant coach's career, has been hailed as one of the best recruiters in the nation. He was credited with landing the bulk of the players on Michigan's 1996 and 1998

NCAA championship teams, and has recruited dozens of All-Americans and several Hobey Baker finalists during his time in Ann Arbor. A total of 54 Michigan players have gone on to play in the NHL since 1988.

Pearson began as assistant coach under Red Berenson in Ann Arbor in 1988 and was promoted to associate head coach prior to the 1999-2000 season. His official duties included working with the forwards and power play. He also served as the program's lead recruiter, working mainly with the US National Development Team, the United States Hockey League and within Michigan and Ontario.

During Pearson's stint at Michigan, the Wolverines won 11 CCHA regular season titles, 9 CCHA playoff championships and advanced to the NCAA Tournament a record 21 consecutive times from 1991-2011. The Wolverines played in the NCAA title game last spring, losing to Minnesota Duluth 3-2 in overtime.

Pearson, who was born in Vancouver, B.C., moved to Minnesota as a youth and played hockey at Edina High School. He was recruited by John MacInnes and played for the legendary coach at Michigan Tech from 1977-81. A forward, Pearson put up 56 points (21-35--56) in 97 career games in a Black and Gold sweater and also earned a degree in business administration while in Houghton. One of his playing highlights included scoring the game-winning goal in the championship game of the 1979 Great Lakes Invitational. The tally broke a 4-all deadlock to beat Michigan in the longest game in the history of the 44-year tournament.

In 1982, Pearson was hired as an assistant coach at Michigan Tech. He worked under Jim Nahrgang and Herb Boxer during his six-year stay in Houghton. He was responsible for recruiting many high-profile players to Tech including Randy McKay, Scott White, Damian Rhodes and Shawn Harrison.

Outside of the collegiate world, Pearson served as a coach with the 1996 United States World Junior Championship team, which earned a silver medal, the country's best finish at the event at the time. He has also worked numerous USA Select festivals and Michigan Select festivals as head coach, evaluator and assistant coach.

Pearson and his wife, Susie, have three children-Kim (25), Sarah (22) and Paul (19).
